



TIC TAC TOE

For this game you'll need a pair of dice or a deck of cards (Ace = 1 through 9). The object of the game is to mark 3 numbers in a row, horizontally, vertically, or diagonally.

- Player 1 rolls the dice or draws two cards and makes a two-digit number (i.e., 3 and 6 and says, “3 tens, 6 ones = 36” OR “6 tens, 3 ones = 63”)
- Player 1 then marks the two corresponding spaces on the board.
- Player 2 takes a turn and then players alternate turns trying to get a TIC TAC TOE.
- If a player rolls a number that is occupied by their opponent then that player can capture the space.
- If a player rolls a number that THEY already occupy, they may roll again. If no one scores a TIC TAC TOE, the player with the most number of spaces occupied wins.
